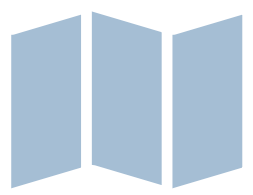


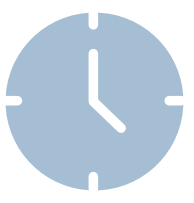
# Palazzo Vecchio

Welcome. The Palazzo Vecchio Museum is located in the heart of Florence, in a historic building that is also the seat of the Florentine municipality. The Palazzo is an extraordinary place, rich in works ranging from the Middle Ages to the late Renaissance, when it became the residence of the Medici Grand Dukes. The elegantly decorated rooms house masterpieces such as Michelangelo Buonarroti's *Victory* and Donatello's *Judith and Holofernes*.



## WHERE

The Museum is located in an area closed to traffic but is easily reached using public transport with a short walk, either from the Santa Maria Novella railway station or from the numerous car parks in the vicinity. If you have difficulty walking, the taxi service is authorised to take you to the entrance door on Via dei Gondi, a privileged access for visitors with mobility difficulties.



## TIMETABLES

The Museum is open daily from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., except on Thursday afternoons. However, we recommend that you inquire about any special closures before coming to visit:

## TICKETS

Tickets can be purchased online, or at the ticket office on the day of the visit. If you wish, you can enrich the experience by also purchasing a ticket to climb the tower, the highest in Florence. Please note, however, that the tower does not have a lift.

Before entering the museum, you will be asked to leave backpacks, bulky bags and umbrellas at the free **cloakroom**, where accessible toilets with changing facilities are also available. In the central courtyard you will also find the museum **bookshop** and a multi-sensory visit orientation station; by using the QR code you can access all the supporting services of the visit.



## INCLUSIVE MUSEUM

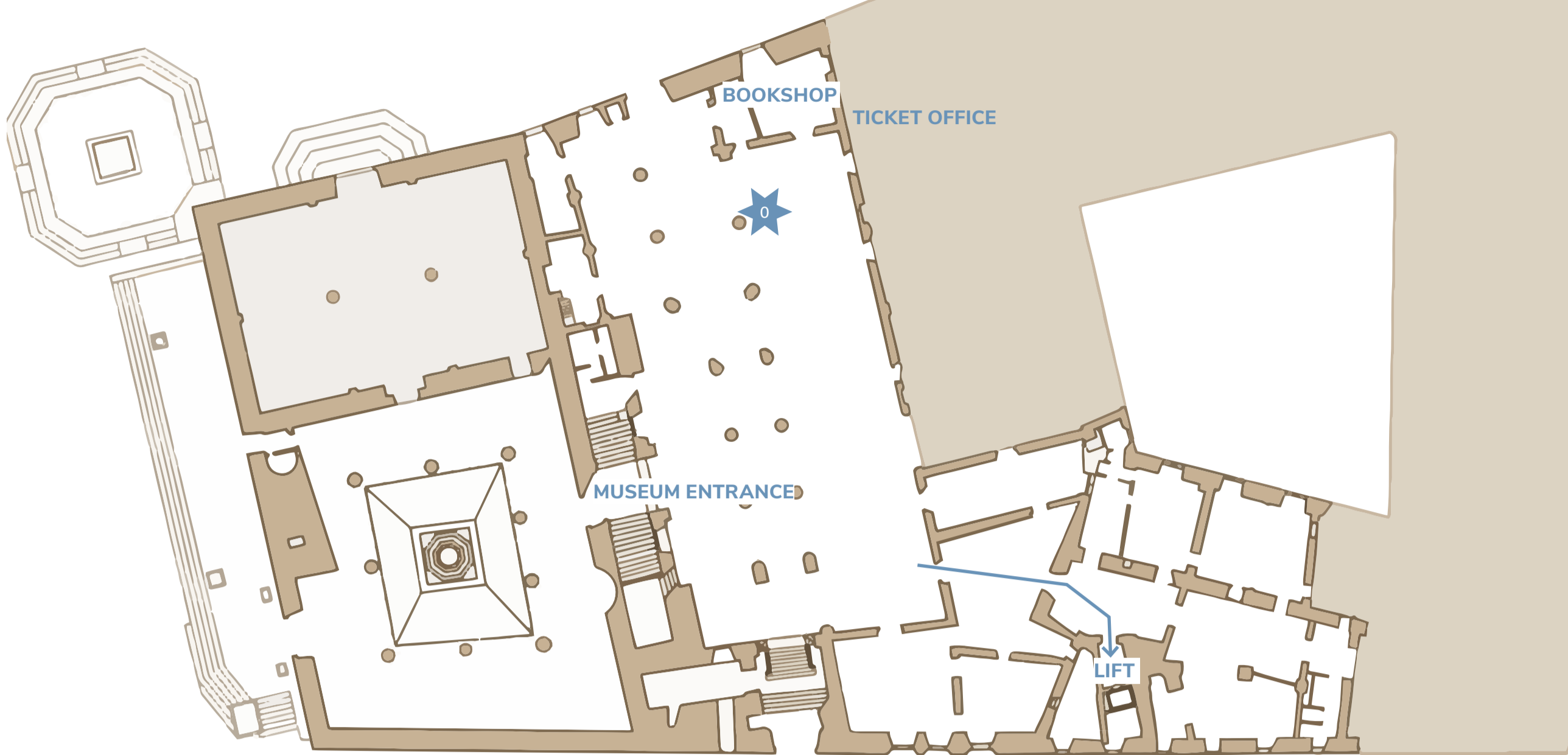

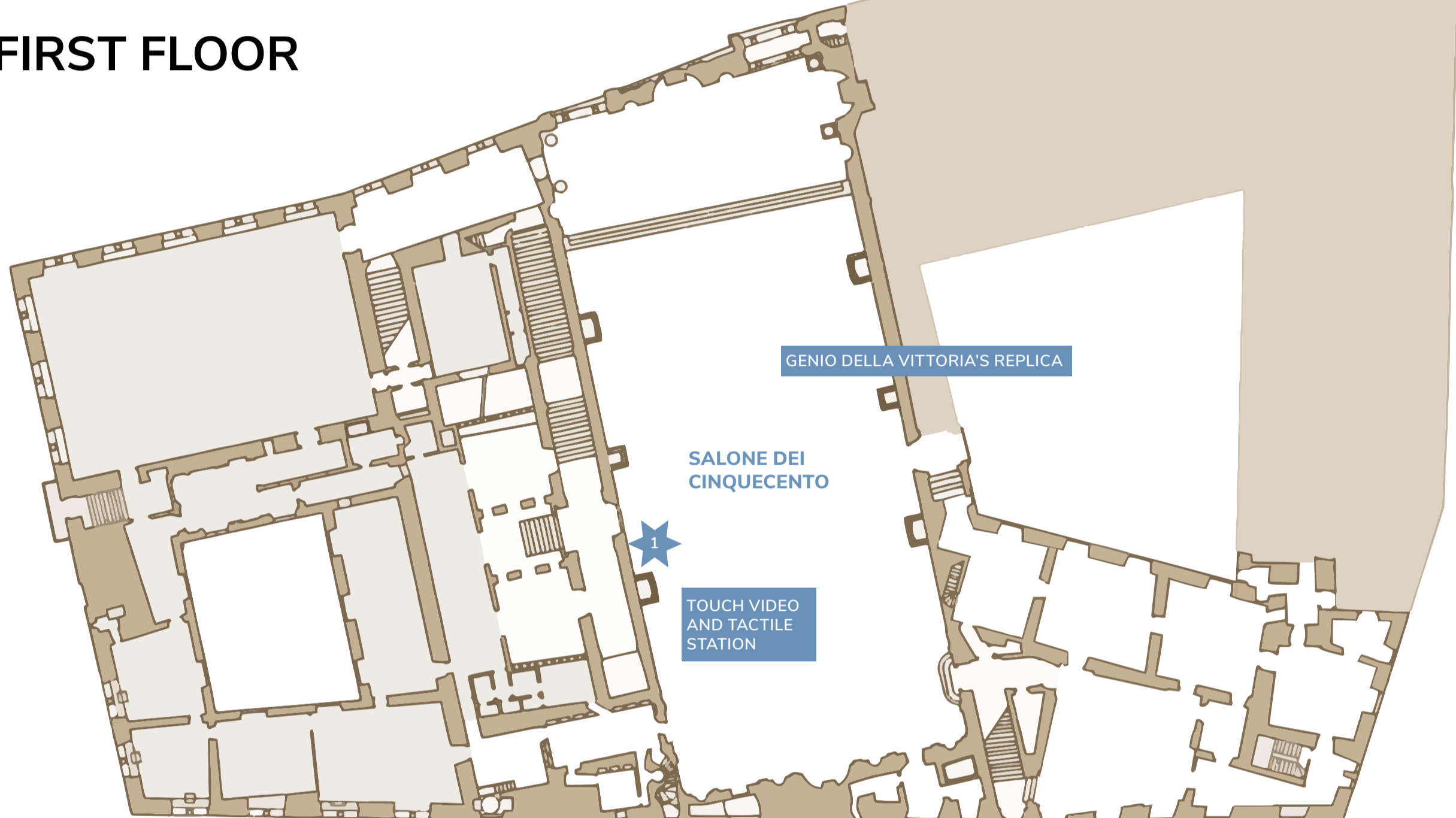

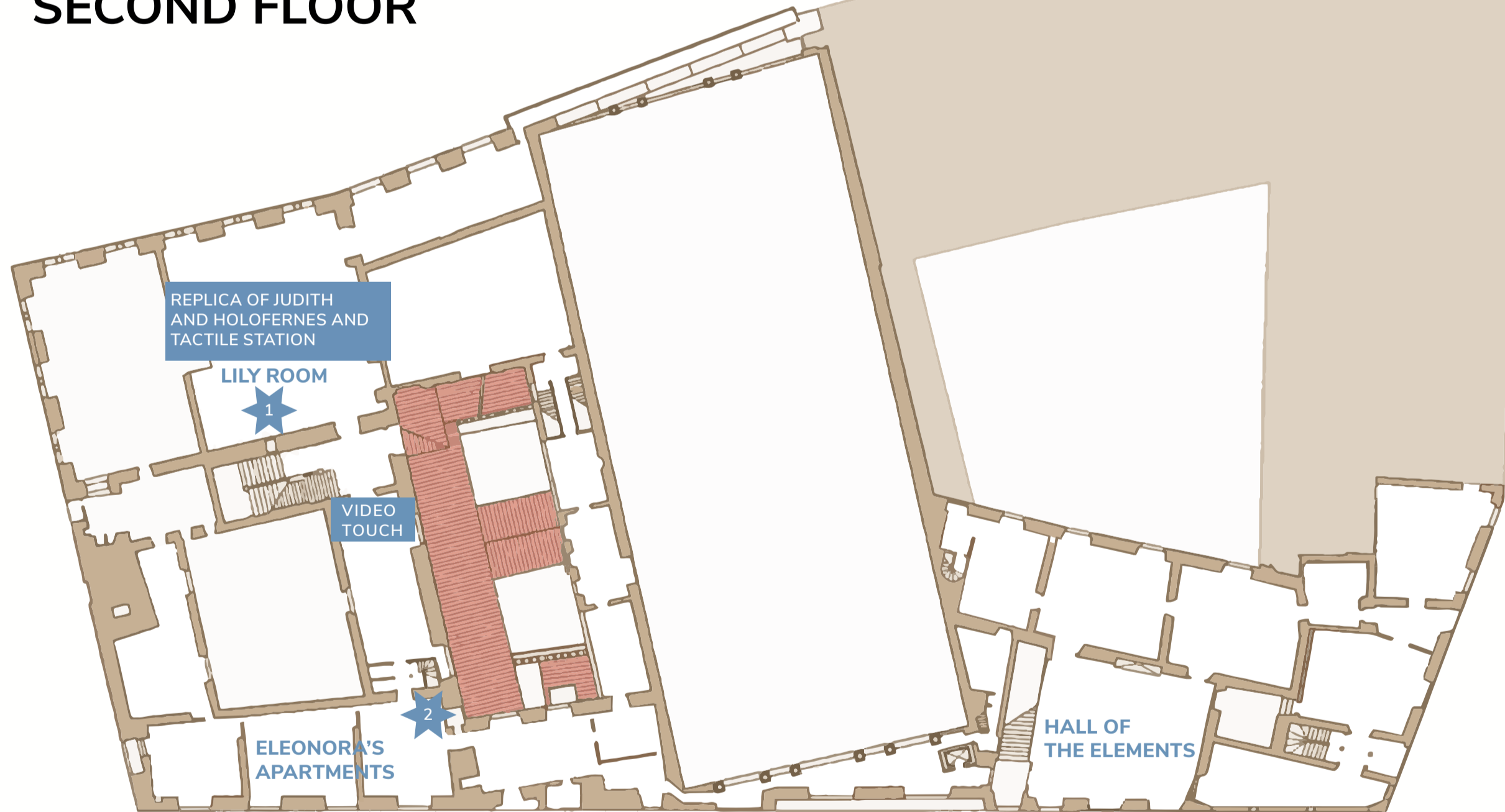
### GROUND FLOOR
